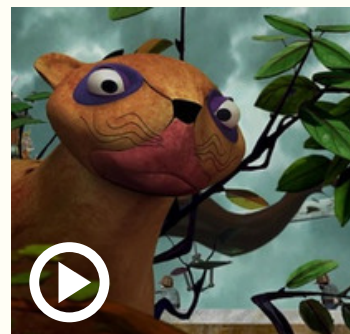

Rembrandt's J'Accuse



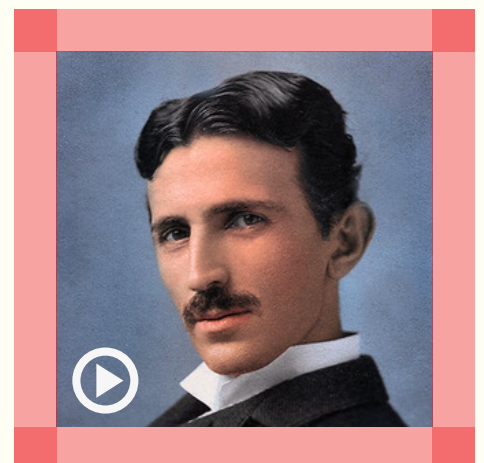

ECQUS: the saviour of our four-legged friends



How many of you have once witnessed an ill dog on the streets, a mistreated horse doing excessive labour, or a cat that is barely alive? And how many of you have actually done something about it? We are not always capable of providing aid to those wonderful creatures, but turning our backs on them shouldn't be even considered, because, thanks to ECQUS, we are now one phone call away from making a difference.

ECQUS, is a Non-Governmental Organization, which means that it does not receive any type of financial help from the government, dedicated to the recovery of ill and injured dogs, cats and horses. Its team is made up of veterinarians and volunteers that are motivated by their love towards these animals in an organisation completely financed by donations and private companies.

This organisation, the first NGO to have aided these animals in Uruguay, has provided rehabilitation and relocation to more than 1.000 animals since 2009, only possible thanks to the unbelievable amounts of effort, dedication and passion from workers, volunteers and donors.

Since its founding in 1994, ECQUS has provided recovery, reintegration, cemetery services, complementary therapies, veterinary services and training to animals for over 24 years.

The British Schools, particularly the Duke of Edinburgh team, has contributed with the organisation during the last year by rising awareness, doing bake sales, placing donation boxes and visiting their premises. We encourage everyone to take action.

The organisation is entirely self-funded and depends on donations. The money goes towards resources for the animals and the maintenance of the building where they stay. They also have the plan to expand in order to help even more ill dogs and cats. You can help by adopting an animal, donating through Abitab or Redpagos, volunteering with your friends in its centres, and sharing this article with your friends to spread the message!

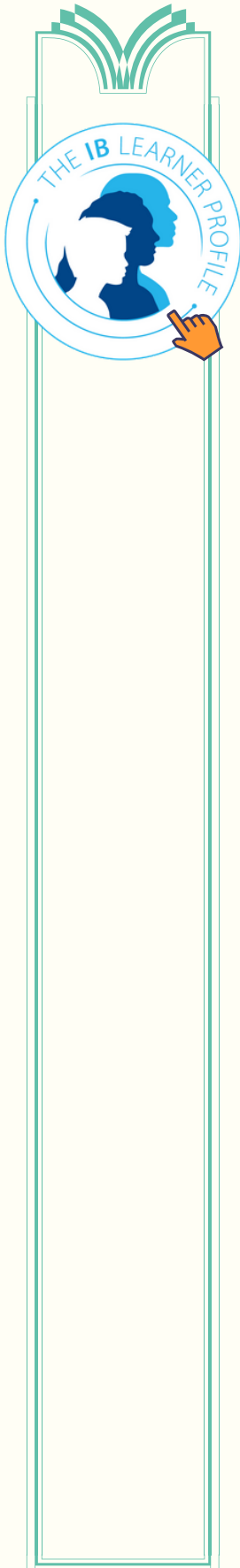

NASA Releases Logo For Upcoming 60th Anniversary



In 2018, NASA will mark the 60th anniversary of its establishment as a U.S. government agency. President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed NASA's founding legislation, the 1958 National Aeronautics and Space Act, on July 29, 1958. NASA considers its birthday to be Oct. 1, the day the agency opened for business.

NASA has released an official logo for use in observing this milestone anniversary. Created by NASA graphic artist Matthew Skeins, the logo depicts how NASA is building on its historic past to soar toward a challenging and inspiring future.

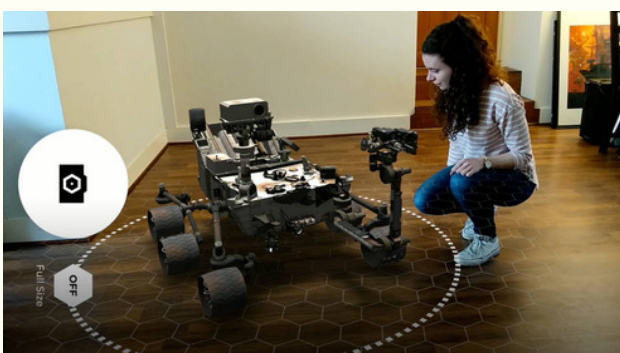
